Unit 2: Requesting

Description of the Learning Activities	Timing (minutes)	Materials/ Equipment Required	Assessment/ Evaluation
 Activity 1: Requesting: The trainer asks the following questions: How do you phrase a request? (Collect Answers) How do you make specific/ positive/ doable and in the present moment request? (Brainstorming) 	<u>15 min.</u>	Markers and Flipchart.	All participants will engage in the activities.
A Pattern is then introduced: Observation : [When you [see, hear, etc.] // Feeling : [Are you feeling?] // [Needs : Because you need] // [Request : [And would you like?]) Participants are then asked to practice.			



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The trainer asks them to state if there was something in a group, or			
during this workshop that irritated them. They are then asked to			
describe the situation in a non-violent communication way.			
Activity 2: Drawing (Verbal Communication)	50 min. (Part 1 & 2 - 15 minutes each) Feedback (Team and Group –	Pen and Paper	Participants will engage in all group activities
The aim is to demonstrate how Verbal Communication can sometimes			
be inaccurate or not clear enough.			
The team is separated into groups of two. Each member is seated on a		ack and –	
chair with their back to their partner. They hold a piece of paper where:			
Part 1: P.1 draws 3 shapes on the paper and verbally communicates			
the type and location of the shape to P.2 so they can produce the			
same drawing.	20 minutes each)		
Once the drawings are completed, they compare them.			
Part 2: P. 2 is drawing an object on the paper but is only allowed to			
describe it through the shapes it contains. Once P.1's drawing is			
complete, the team shares feedback between them and with the group.

team to calculate Karim's height:			
Karim is 4 cm taller than Janusz - Janusz has the same height as			
Diana - Diana is 3 cm shorter than Henri -Henri is 6 cm taller than			
Branco - Branco is 20 cm shorter than Irma - Irma is 5 cm taller than Udo - Udo has the same height as Asha - Asha is 6 cm taller than			
Besim - Besim is 6 cm taller than Igor - Igor is 16 cm shorter than			
Sonia - Sonia is 5 cm taller than Frank -Frank is 1.77cm tall.
