In this activity, the facilitator holds a small ball with the word integration written on it and asks the participants to sit in a circle. The ball should be thrown from participant to participant in a mixed order. Every time a participant holds the ball, he/she should mention what integration means to him/her in one word. The facilitator writes on the flipchart every word that is mentioned by the participants. After that, the facilitator presents a slide show presentation, with European Union definitions of Integration and Human Rights. Then, all participants compare and discuss the definitions, with their own previous characterizations.
