Title of Resource:	“How to turn a group of strangers into a team”
Why use this resource?	<p>As participants don't know each other well yet, they may still feel a bit uncomfortable stressed or find it difficult to work together as a group.</p> <p>This TED Talk shares the elements needed to turn a group of strangers into a quick-thinking team that can nimbly respond to challenges.</p>
What will you get from using this resource?	<p>Thanks to this recalling stories of teamwork combined with important elements of collaboration, participants will feel much more comfortable with each other. They will understand that people whose knowledge and skills are different can and need to work together, across boundaries created by expertise, distance, and status.</p>
